ADVENT



The first day of Advent - the fourth Sunday before Christmas - is on **Sunday, 1**st **December**, and so begins a wonderful time for everyone, young and old, to give attention and gratitude to our world.

This year we print an enlightening piece from the book *The Light in the Lantern*, written by Georg Drißig, a book full of little stories for Advent. Below is the preface of his book. We will also include four stories from his book, two at the back of this Pabulum, and two stories in next week's Pabulum.

The Light in the Lantern - preface Written by Georg Drißig

There is something beautiful that many families do every Advent. They make an Advent Garden in which they gradually build up the scenery Mary and Joseph will be going through with their little donkey on their way to Bethlehem.

Using a brown cloth as a foundation they lay out, during the **first week** of Advent, just the **stones/shells**, the most beautiful of which go to the make the path on which Mary will tread. In the **second week** the **plants** are added - moss and cones and even some pot plants as 'palm trees', in the **third week** the **animals** - especially the grazing sheep - and in the **fourth** and last week **human beings**, shepherds keeping watch over their sheep. As the landscape takes shape the little stories at the back of this *Pabulum* (stone and plant), and next week's *Pabulum* (animals and human beings) can form an accompaniment to it, as they also ascend, during the course of the four weeks of Advent, through the elements to the kingdom of the plants, then to the animals, and finally to the human realm.

The stories are intended for reading aloud. Children of school age can have them as kind of an Advent calendar in which the stories proceed week by week towards Christmas. It is more suitable for smaller children if you read one story each week. They can not only listen to each week when the Advent candles are burning but also act it, perhaps, and help to portray it in the Advent Garden.

These stories were inspired first and foremost by a joyful anticipation of Christmas. However, this fact not only awakened a delight in storytelling; it primarily stimulated a desire to demonstrate on a childlike level that the whole of creation eagerly awaits the arrival of Christmas. Thus there should be a feeling that the light of Christmas gradually becomes brighter and brighter from story to story until its full brilliance is reached on Christmas Eve. I owe some of the ideas to well-known Christmas stories, however the ultimate encouragement that brought these stories into being was a pair of shining child's eyes, full of belief in miracles, and two little ears that wanted to hear more and more.


(Week One and Two of Advent)
