



Perth Waldorf School invites
Applications for
Part-time Set Designer and Builder (~10 hours per week)

Commencing in Term 1, 2025

We are seeking a **creative and independent worker** who can design and construct sets that are safe and suitable for school plays. For each play (8 during the year) they would need to work closely with the production team to establish the creative vision and budget for each production, and then undertake and coordinate basic set design, building, painting and prop creation.

There would also be a need to assist the lighting technician in maintaining, updating and ensuring the safety of the Drama Department equipment. All work is expected to comply with WHS and industry standards.

At times there would be a requirement to instruct and oversee small groups of students who would assist in the work.

There will be some flexibility in the work hours, and the hours required each week may vary according to the production schedule.

The successful applicants will have good communication skills, the ability to take direction while being clear about boundaries, an ability to work under pressure, and be able to complete the physical components of the work. A qualification in Carpentry or Theatrical, Creative or Fine Arts would be advantageous but the hourly rate will not reflect such a qualification necessarily. You will be working in a limited, not fit for purpose space, so a “make-do” attitude is vital!

Where: The school is located in a bushland setting in Bibra Lake. Nearby is the popular and cosmopolitan town of Fremantle and the school is only 15 minutes from the coast. We provide a full Steiner curriculum from Playgroup to Class 12. You would need to be interested to learn more about Steiner education and how it informs the drama programme.

Applicants must have a valid Working with Children Check or a willingness to apply.
Applicants must have Australian residency or possession of a valid visa with work entitlement in Australia (no option for sponsorship).
